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# Delivery highlights



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- 21% (3000+) bus stops with raised kerbs
- European Greenway 1st prize for Kirklees (2007)
- 3 FreeCityBus routes carrying 2.4m passengers (2007/08)
  - Leeds, Huddersfield & Wakefield
- 7 MetroLocal bus routes in Kirklees (Metro & LAC funding)
- £14m p.a. on socially necessary tendered bus services
- Tendered service budget trials of:
  - Service linking hospital & PCT facilities with N. Bradford communities
  - 25 Boxing Day (2007) bus services in Kirklees & Leeds
- 90 individual rural transport projects across WY
- 480 free monthly MetroCards provided to job seekers
- Yournextbus service responding to 3million text queries
- 500 Real Time display units in shelters
- Bus Performance Improvement Partnerships (PIPs)
- Accessibility Partnerships

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# Progress against accessibility target



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- **Target:** 89.5% of households without access to a car should be within 30 minutes of a hospital by public transport by 2011
- **Baseline:** 89.5%
- **September 2008:** 72.7 %
  
- Target not being met mostly consequence of bus operators (informed by real time info) changing running times to reflect impacts of traffic congestion, and sensitivity of Accession.
  
- Questions?:
  - Usefulness of accession measurement
  - Meaningfulness of LTP target - in light of NHS reconfiguration / difficulties defining what a hospital is / move to more local services
  - Has target relating only to hospitals limited opportunities to engage with partners on other accessibility issues
  - Need for more tangible (output focused) targets?
